Art in the Nave 28th - 30th August 2021 11 am to 5pm. Preview evening Friday 27th August 7pm

Following a special meeting of the PCC on Monday 2nd August final planning arrangements for Art in the Nave will now proceed and we may look forward to a successful festival. I attended a PCC meeting on 19th July to highlighted a significant change in the approach taken by the Government in relation to the control of coronavirus on 19th July. It effectively removed most legislation and instead coronavirus emphasised personal and corporate responsibility of individuals and organisations to protect others and themselves. In light of those changes, it was necessary to consider how best to move forward without these legal restrictions and decide how best to manage the risk to ourselves and others at this year's Art in the Nave Festival.

I am pleased to say that after careful consideration St Mary and St Paul PCC have agreed that the Art in the Nave Festival will proceed as planned.

That decision has been reached after due consideration of measures to be taken to ensure that we mitigate risks to our exhibiting artists, volunteer stewards, and of course visitors to the exhibition. The process has been greatly enhanced by the views expressed by artists and helpers who were consulted and responded with their views on the matter. It was decided that a number of precautionary measures that will be implemented for Art in the Nave 2021 some examples of these are as follows:

Wearing face coverings will be encouraged and a supply of face masks will be available free of charge during the exhibition. (as of 30th July 2021 over 95% of people are continuing to wear face coverings in public indoor spaces.

The maximum number of exhibiting artists has been restricted to 30 artists, to give each display, socially distanced space.

St Mary's church is a very tall and large building, with plenty of space, however doors and windows will be opened during exhibition opening hours, where possible.

Refreshments will be served in our cafe/bar space and outside as well, weather permitting.

The entry point will be separated from the sales desk to avoid queuing and bottlenecks forming.

Should it be necessary, during busy periods then numbers admitted to the exhibition at any one time will be monitored and controlled.

We can now look forward to extending a warm welcome to our artists and visitors to Art in the Nave this year. Members of St Mary and St Paul congregations are welcome to attend the preview evening. If you would like to be invited to attend the preview please let me know as numbers are limited this year.

The PCC is considering what options to pursue for the musical life of the Parish. As you know we have no organist or director of music and St. Mary's services are being covered by engaging any organist available (mostly Andrew). The PCC agreed to fund the position from the Salisbury bequest for two years and that period has now expired. Upon the recommendation of the Bishop of Hertford we have engaged the assistance of Marie Wright, RSCM education chair for St. Albans, Hertford and Bedford, to give expert and independent advice on possible options. She will be available to talk to after the 9:30 service at St. Mary's on Sunday 15th August. Since we recognise not everyone will be able to speak in person we are also arranging for a survey to be carried out. Watch this space for future details.
