2018 - The area is known as Zone 23, Nomonde, a crowded area of shacks with homes made of materials such as corrugated iron, tarpaulin, and wood. Nomonde Pre-School before LTPT investment projects, comprised dilapidated buildings, unsuitable play equipment and poor security.










December 2018 - Two new classrooms with a canopy and a stoep constructed and equipped.







The local community also benefits from this facility as the school is able to share its water with some local people.







In July 2019 major external painting, important for the preservation of the building, was financed by Cheltenham College(photo left). More recently the outside has been given a makeover organised and undertaken by the Bishop's College VUSA Rugby and Learning Academy. In April 2020 new perimeter fencing was erected to improve the safety and security of the site enabling the work on the play area with the installation of new equipment to commence.













The final stage in the 'Nomonde Project' has been the establishment of a vegetable garden, both as a teaching resource and as a source of vegetables for the pre-school kitchen. Thanks to an initiative by Nadia Petersen, financial support by LTPT, some free labour from Clarence Petersen and, through Cape Town's 'Ladles of Love', the very welcome gift of professional advice, seeds, soils, fertilisers and training.

Now the first season's vegetables have been planted and successfully harvested.

It plans garden lay out, establishes gardens, plants and hosts training workshops. Over the last 5 months it has worked at Nomonde as the photo illustrates.





Financial Out-turn 2020/21

On 9 October the Board authorised that the Report and Accounts for 2020/21 be passed to the Independent Examiner, Ian Aikman.

They concluded that LTPT had come well through the difficult pandemic period.

The headline figures were:

Income £28,114,

Expenditure £26,963,

Surplus £1,151.

With no profit making events possible the Trust had benefited from regular donations and those arising from special appeals totalling nearly £22,000.

Changes in Objects: UK Langa Township Pre-School Trust

In view of the various changes to the ways in which the Trust is operating in Langa the Trustees decided the Objects of the Trust should be reviewed. As a result and, through due process involving the Charity Commission, the Objects now are:

'To advance education for the benefit of the public of the township of Langa, Cape Town, South Africa, by supporting the Nomonde Educare Initiative and any other pre-school initiatives in the township through assistance such as materials, equipment and furnishings and direct financial assistance, the provision of professional advice and such assistance as deemed appropriate.'
